'SMART CITIES MISSION - ACCOUNTANCY CAPACITY BUILDING'



he Institute of Directors, India organized a 'one-day' Workshop on 'Smart Cities Mission' on Wednesday, 14th December, 2016 at Hotel Eros International, New Delhi, The theme was 'Accountancy Capacity Building'.

The Workshop was organized in close collaboration with Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), UK and the Institute of Cost Accountants of India (ICAI), ACCA has a membership of around 188,000 members as Chartered Accountants in over 178 countries.

Lt. Gen. J.S.Ahluwalia. PVSM (retd.). President. Institute of Directors in his Welcome Address thanked ACCA for partnering with IOD, India in this pioneering venture especially in India. He explained the concept of 'Special Purpose Vehicle' which will be created for the purpose of Smart City Project, SPV will be an autonomous body that will ensure quick decision - making and operational independence.

The core infrastructure of the Smart City will cover adequate water supply, sanitation and solid waste management, fast urban mobility and public transport. It will especially cater for affordable housing for the poor, as also citizen participation. It will have safety design for security of children, women and the elderly. IT connectivity will be a special focus.

Ms. Helen Brand, OBE, Global Chief Executive, ACCA delivered the Keynote Address. She had flown in all the way from London to deliver her address at the IOD Workshop. She presented a global picture of the funding of smart cities all over the world. "The challenge is to maximize limited resources for effective processes and the best technology available". She stressed on a ethical approach to the issue. She gave the projection of a 50% increase in urban population around the world, up to two billion over the next 30 years. She visualized the role of accountants as "finance professional and ethical guardians who will be involved not only in budget planning but also forecasting".

Dr. Maggie McGhee, Director - Professional Insights, ACCA, UK and an authority on Public Sector Accounting Standards in Europe presented a special research paper on 'Building Capacity within the Accounting Community to support the Smart Cities Mission'. Dr. McGhee described Smart Cities as the cities of the future - "it is not a destination but a journey of continuous improvement". The focus will have to be as much on accounting and financial management as on technology. She gave a brief overview of the seminal report on the theme - "Spotlight on India" by ACCA and ICAI, with the special focus on India. According to her research, for the first time in world history, the city dwellers will outnumber the rural population. She dwelt on the Indian Smart Cities Mission for creation of more than 100 smart cities in India. She had conducted a research with representatives of more than 40 cities in India. "The Smart Cities will come in all shapes and sizes, and the implementation will be done by municipalities".

Later, a copy of the pioneering research study was released during the Workshop.

Dr. Sudhir Krishna, IAS (retd.), former Secretary, Urban Development,











Govt. and Chairman, Committee on Standards on Smart Cities of the Bureau or Indian Standards and the TIRAC Committees on Smart Habitats was the Guest of Honour. Dr. Pankaj Gupta, Vice-Dean & Prof. Jindaí Global School delivered the Special Address on the main them. He coultied the Gandhian concept of "obtaining more and more from less and less resources". He explained that the accountary profession has the main role in preparing the Total Impact Assessment on moving from big cities to small cities. At the same time, the quality of life should not be compromised. He gave the international example of involving general public in planning, like the construction of Swork Tumel.

Shri S P Pathak, Principal Commissioner, Planning, Delhi Development Authority was the next expert speaker on the subject. He dwelt on the theme of Green Buildings and how these minimize waste and pollution. He stressed on the concept of 'Land Pooling'. He also emphasized the importance of 'Sustainable Mindset'. He stressed on the importance of local area plans so that we also have Smart Wards. He explained the concent of 'Green Cities' on the PP Model.

Mr. Manas Thakur, President, ICAI also addressed the gathering. He was accompanied by Shri Sanjay Gupta, Vice dresisdent, ICAI. Shri Thakur in his Special Address stressed the importance of Capacicy Building' which implies 'resource mapping and resource mobilization'. He stressed the importance of Municipalities and the need to upgrade the existing accounting procedures.

Shri Shekhar Dutt, IAS (redd), former Defence Secretary, Grovt of India and former Governor, Chhattisgath was the Chief Guest. He shared his experience as an administrator who was closely involved in conceptualization and planning of New Raipur, the capital city of Chhattisganh. He stressed on the three main concepts in unbrap nlanning-energy management, waste management and traffic management. "Smart City means tool only infrastructure but also smart governance,"















He gave the example of Atlanta City and how it was upgraded for the Olympics.

The IOD in-house experts also spoke to the audience about developing the connection between smart cities and the boards which are located in cities and too it rural areas.
